Womens Aims GOOD FOR ALFALFA

Most Farms Can Produce This Wonderful Plant In Abundance.

Alfalfa can be grown on most Minnesota farms, says A. C. Gray of the University farm, where the soil is acid.

When conditions of soil and climate are at all favorable, 12 to 14 pounds of seed is enough for an acre.

Inoculation is strongly recommended by Mr. Gray as it increases both root and top growth.

Deep plowing in the fall, after barnyard manure has been applied to the soil, is recommended.

Mr. Wolfe Criticizes Road

Minneapolis, April 7th.
 To the road overseer of the town of Chagwatawa, who is supposed to have charge of the 1/4 mile south of Sec. 6-39-30. Can you give any good reason why this piece of road has been left in the condition it has for the last ten years. All the money that has been spent on that road in the last ten years has been thrown to the dogs, as anything they have ever done has never been finished on right. They put a ditch along on side of the road and then left a high spot at the top of the hill at my house that backs the water clear around to the N. W. corner of that 40, where if they had cut that ditch about 3 ft. and filled in from the culvert to the bridge they would have had at least something to show for their work. We would have been able to drive in and out there at all if we did not fix it up every once in a while ourselves. I have filled ruts around that culvert myself with a wheel barrow and shovel from a foot to two feet deep. They put in a culvert there and made a ditch on the north side of the road to carry the water into it and then never made anyway for it to get away at the south end and the one-eighth of a mile from the foot of that hill to the bridge has never been in a passable condition. A lumber wagon. Since that bridge was put in we have had to pull out nearly every auto that has tried to get through there, and are getting sick of it.

Now my taxes are running close to \$200 a year and if part of this is supposed to be spent towards keeping the roads in a passable condition, I claim they have been getting this money on false pretenses and I am going to see a lawyer about it and see if there is any way of having it returned. I have been peevish about the question for about 10 years now but have been very patient, but it seems to be getting worse every year, so I am going to try and see if I can't start something.
