





We spent the seventh grade bungling, tramping and gawking. Mr. Saunders, our science teacher, prophesied that when we were seniors, our basketball team would win the District Tournament. In the partitioned lunchroom, where we had our English and History classes, we had a difficult time distinguishing Miss O'Connor's voice from Mr. Harvey's.

Besides the usual eighth grade studies, we also learned the delicate art of writing five-hundred word themes, particularly on the subjects of 'Talking' or 'Chewing Gum'. Those were Miss Flaa's pet peeves, as everyone in Mathematics class soon discovered.

Two main attractions prevailed our freshman year. The boys were fascinated by the windows in Miss Furni's English class room, and could be seen dangling over the sills at any time, much to Miss Furni's horror. For the frosh 'femmes', the Petraborg boys provided the greatest interest.

Our sophomore year was a flurry of typing papers. For one frantic hour daily, we would peck away at our machines with feverish fingers. Bill Haugen's poor over-worked typewriter suffered a complete collapse one day, and for the rest of the year, was held together with electrician's tape. Dick Boo accidentally broke Catherine Davis' arm when a slight argument arose in Miss Frentz's homeroom.

Our float with its uuusual slogan (see photo) won first prize in the Homecoming Parade our junior year. We all drank cider in "Sherwood Forest" at the Prom.

Mr. Saunders' prophesy came true when we were seniors. We not only won the District Basketball Tournament, but became district football champs as well. We presented "Brother Goose" as the senior class play, and danced at our last high school prom.

The boys have outgrown their knickers; the girls their braids; marble games in the spring mud are over for us. No more will we hang from the second-story windows waving at passing cars, nor will we gulp 'malteds' at the drug store while discussing the latest trivia. Other Dragons will wear the Green and Gray; other voices will cheer them on. And we, Seniors of '45, will leave school as we entered; ready to face the future with eager eyes.
