## MEET FERNANDO

Everything started when I saw an A.F.S. chart in the institute where I was studying English in May, 1962. I filled all the requirements, so my English teacher insisted. I took my first examination in July, 1962, and had the definite answer on July 17, 1963. I was supposed to leave Uruguay, August 19, but we actually did it on the 20th. I said we, because there were 46 Uruguayans coming, and 13 Americans returning home.

My first impression of the United States, was a very "warm" one. In summer and in Florida. I think none of us realized when we stepped out of the plane, what was going on. We couldn't believe we were in the United States.

My actual impression is how friendly and wonderful people are here, and how different, and at the same time how similar are my country and America.
