## Cevat Demircan

While I was in Turkey I never thought that I would ever come to the U. S. English was always one of my most difficult subjects. But my English teacher suggested that I take the test to be a foreign exchange student to America. This action would change my future plans so it was an important decision for me to follow his suggestion. However after visiting the "American Information and News Office" I knew it would be a rare opportunity for me to learn about America and its language first hand. In February 1964 I took the first test of the program. On August 14, 110 students and I left Turkey for our various destinations after being chosen. At the end of a pleasant journey we first arrived in New York City. In the short time we stayed there I really became an admirer of this great city. I arrived in Pine City on August 17. I immediately saw that your community was very different than mine. Many things impressed me but my first and greatest impression was of the people. Your customs are so much more unusual as compared with mine but in spite of that the people have been extremely cooperative and helped me with my difficulties of adjustment. I shall long remember the warm experiences of America and its people, especially the students of Pine City. Thank you.
