# Free Afternoon Shows At Co. Fair Grandstand

A special treat to the public attending the County Fair this year, July 31, August 1 and 2, the grandstand shows Friday and Saturday afternoons will be presented free of charge. The caliber of the shows will be as high as ever, with some outstanding horse races on Friday. A preview presentation of the Chippewa Valley Barn Dance show, the main evening feature, will also be seen Friday afternoon. Saturday afternoon's show will include the annual 4-H parade and a special novelty act of Dog and Donkey show.

There will, of course, be musical entertainment furnished by various county organizations before each grandstand presentation both afternoon and evening. One of the highlights in this category will be a demonstration by the Pine City American Legion Drum & Bugle Corps. This corps, which is developing into one of the finest organizations in the state, will perform before the wrestling show begins Saturday night. Arrangements are now being made to contract an outstanding 8-year-old majorette from Minneapolis who has marched with the Corps previously in the city. Her name is Diana Tester, and her accomplish-

ments are many in her field. She will undoubtedly add much color to the Saturday evening entertainment.

Reserved tickets for the wrestling show are now on sale for \$1.50. General admission tickets will sell for one dollar at the ticket office. All children under 8 years old will be admitted to the wrestling show **FREE** this year.

The wrestling card, with Paul BMaillargeon (the world's strongest wrestler) and Butch Levy, together with Otto Kuss and Johnny Moochy, will without a doubt be the strongest ever presented in Pine City. This statement is notwithstanding the extra thrills to be witnessed by the strongman's horse lifting demonstration.
