

# Message from the Board

Our third year of operation found us taking on more projects that encompass our mission to collect, preserve and disseminate knowledge about the history of the Pine City area.

- The Rural School Museum merged with the Pine City Area History Association this past spring. While the Rural School Museum committee will continue to oversee the operation of the Rural School Museum we are pleased to be able to partner with them to help preserve and share this important aspect of local history.
- We brought the privy diggers to town.
  We arranged a few different digs in town and would love to schedule some more.
  There is no cost to having them dig, it is fascinating and the homeowner ends up with some interesting finds.
- We entered the retail world this year with two products we created and sold. The first was a book entitled "Pine City Remembers Highway 61". Local history along Highway 61 was explored and recorded in the book. Our second project was a 2016 calendar which was based on the History Hunt program we developed with the Pine City Public Library. The calendar contained an interactive feature. In addition to the historic photo for each month there was a QR code that triggered a short video with more information about the featured site. Watch for our 2017 calendar coming out soon.
- We have created a guide brochure on the Military Road. It includes a history of the Military Road system, a map and

- a guide to explore the local segments of the road. The brochure is available at area businesses and on line at our website.
- We have cataloged Bob Thiry's negatives. This was a huge task and we couldn't have done it without the help of Margery Swanson. Our next task will be to make the catalog available online.
- Our general meetings continue to be well attended. Topics this year were; history of the Pine City paper, telling your own personal history, privy digging, and when i35 came to town.
- We started an online collection of local family histories. They make fascinating reading even if they are not your relatives. They are available to read on our website. Click on the people tab.

This third year has been a busy one but we want to acknowledge and thank the family of Bayliss Swanson. Bayliss was one of the first members of the Thursday local history group and rarely missed a meeting. When Bayliss died last fall his family requested memorials be sent to the history association.
