### History of the site



The first Methodist Episcopal Church built in this location.

On July 17, 1888, on land donated by Royal C. Gray of Taylors Falls, the foundation for a new church was begun in this location. The church was dedicated October 21, 1888. The total cost of the building was \$1,550.



Another view of the first church. In the background on the left is the first parsonage, built in about 1914. It still stands on the northeast corner of this block.



By 1922 the congregation was outgrowing the space and in 1925 a building fund was established and committees formed.

An architect, W. L. Alban of St. Paul, was hired. Frank Bukachek was hired as the contractor and the building of the new church began in the spring of 1927. The old church was torn down and the materials were used in the new church.

#### CONTRACT LET FOR NEW M. E. CHURCH

On Wednesday afternoon bids for he new Methodist Episcopal church in this city were opened by the building committee, and the contract was let to Frank Bukacek of this city, for \$12, 334.34. The Askov Construction Co., was next low, there being a difference of about \$85.

The contract for the heating was awarded to W. A. Sauser at \$671, and the plumbing roughed in was let to Mr. Sauser on a bid of \$179.

The Kolar Electric Company was warded the contract for the wiring

Ten bidders were on hand to try for the job and the session was a five hour affair in which all phases of the work were gone into.

An allowance was made for the old church building and the contractor will tear the building down at his own expense. Other items incidental to the work were agreed upon by the contractor and the building committee and work will start-on the building with a very few days. The building will be somewhat longer than at first decided on and some minor matters will be left for completion in the fu-

One thing or another has delayed the letting of this contract, but now that things are under way, they will be pushed to completion as fast as conditions permit .

Frank Bukachek, the contractor, often bought supplies at Sauser's Hardware. Each purchase was carefully recorded in Ledger #16.






